

Time Lapse Video of One World Trade Center Updated

In an effort to memorialize and rebuild a new World Trade Center complex in lower Manhattan, the National September 11 Memorial Plaza is now open to the public, while construction on surrounding buildings forges ahead.

To commemorate the efforts, a new time-lapse movie will soon be released showing progress to date at the new One World Trade Center (1WTC), which broke ground in April 2006. The broadcast-quality video is made available by EarthCam, a live network of streaming video surveillance, and features multiple cameras and new footage from across the Hudson River, highlighting major accomplishments in 1WTC's construction as we gear up towards its debut opening in 2013.

Topping 1WTC—expected in August of this year—is symbolic of the revitalization of New York's downtown communities. Daily construction progress can also be followed on EarthCam's website and through mobile phone applications as the building rises against the city's skyline, as what is now New York City's tallest skyscraper.
