

Rise of a field of dreams: Atlanta Braves' new SunTrust Park stadium comes together in a fascinating 90 second time-lapse video shot over the course of TWO YEARS

The new SunTrust stadium was started February 2015 and finished this April

Two hours of building is edited together in a 90-second video

The construction of the stadium was watched over by EarthCam

The new Atlanta Braves SunTrust Park ball stadium opened in April and a time-lapse camera caught every second of the stadium's building.

Started in February 2015, designed by Populous and built by American Builders, the stadium came to life under the watchful eye of [EarthCam](#), hired by the Braves' organization to document the new baseball stadium just outside of Atlanta.

It took just slightly over two years to build the stadium, which is described as more like a small city, but will take only 90 seconds to watch the time-lapse of its coming into being.

The stadium is eventually meant to be surrounded by 60 bars, restaurants, and shopping areas, 4,000-seat Live Nation concert hall, an Omni Hotel, and a Comcast office building, reported [Hard Ball Times](#).
