

Warhol Cam making it possible for people to pay tribute to pop artist

Today would have been Andy Warhol's 87th birthday. People are invited to celebrate wherever they are by dropping in on the [EarthCam Warhol Cam](#).

On its website, EarthCam, which has webcams trained on significant sites all over the world, has a live 24/7 video stream from Warhol's gravesite at St. John the Baptist Byzantine Catholic Cemetery in Bethel Park and at St. John Chrysostom Byzantine Catholic Church, the Greenfield church where he was baptized.

EarthCam teamed up with The Andy Warhol Museum and St. John Chrysostom Byzantine Catholic Church to present this virtual tribute. People are invited to go online and send the late pop artist a greeting through the EarthCam site — either an image of a Campbell's Soup can for \$10, a bouquet of flowers (\$25) or a soup can and flowers combo (\$50). They also can include a written message. They'll receive an email letting them know when they can watch their greeting being delivered on the video stream. Part of the proceeds will go to the Greater Pittsburgh Community Food Bank.
