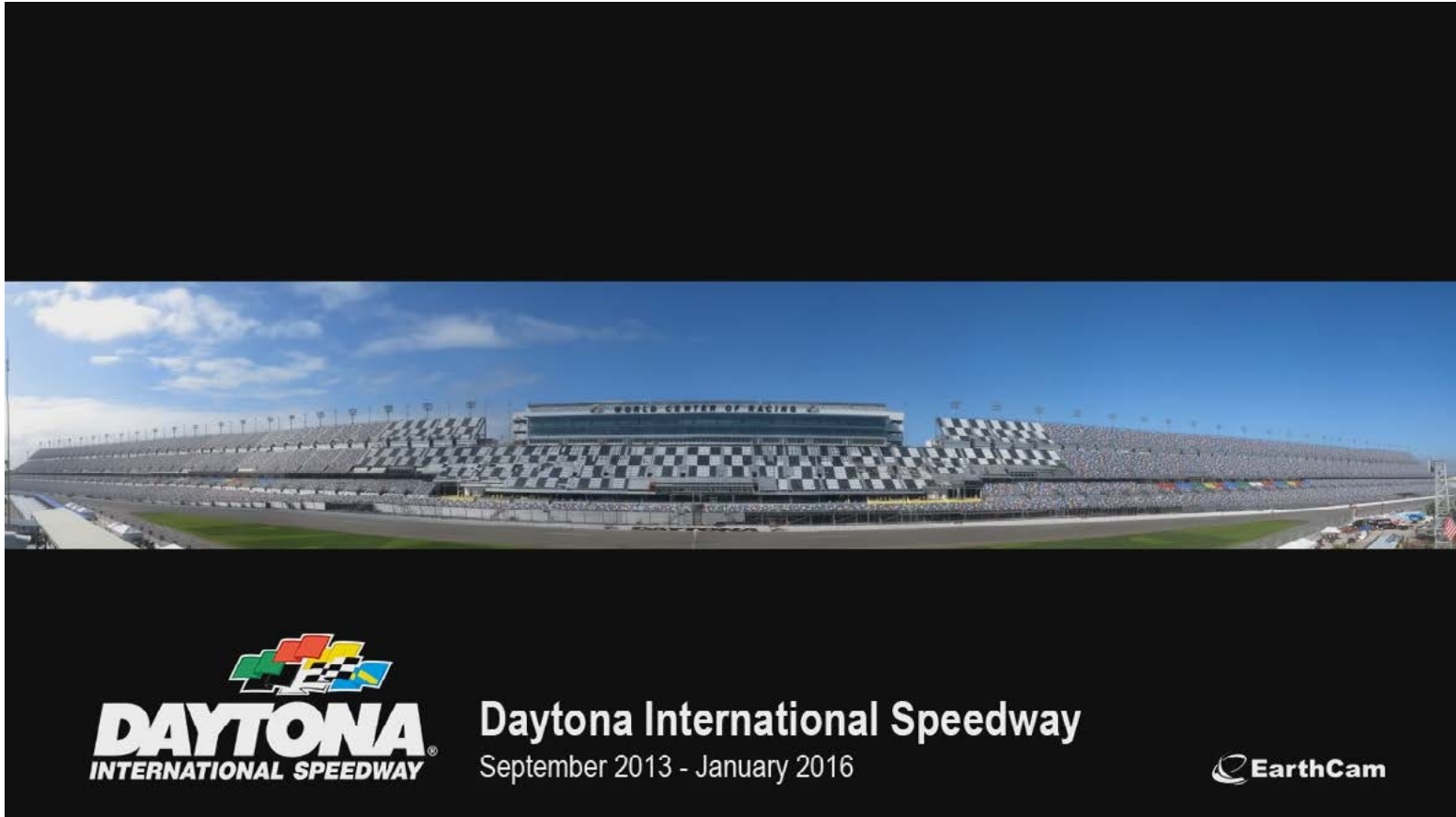


Watch this time-lapse video of the Daytona Rising project

Were you curious what two-plus years of major construction and renovation of the world's most famous racing venue looked like?

Don't worry: You can see exactly how it happened in a time-lapse video that takes less than three minutes to watch.

Two minutes and 20 seconds, actually.

During the 28-month project, more than 1 million high-definition images were captured with eight [EarthCam](#) robotic construction webcams and megapixel panoramic cameras positioned at Daytona International Speedway.
