

Mardi Gras 2015 Live Stream: How To Watch Fat Tuesday Festivities Online

Mardi Gras 2015 falls on Tuesday, Feb. 17 in New Orleans, LA even though parades began Feb. 6 and celebrations took place the weekend before Mardi Gras (Feb. 13- 17). Each year, the last day of the carnival, also called Fat Tuesday, falls a day before Ash Wednesday.

If you're not able to be in New Orleans in person, then know that you can still watch the Fat Tuesday festivities from the comfort of your home or office using your computer. There are several official live streams of the parades offered from many outlets. Take, for instance, Nola.com, which will be offering two parade cameras — one with audio and one without. You can find both NOLA.com Mardi Gras Parade Cam's below.

EarthCam also has [live webcams on Bourbon Street](#), which is the main street where most of the celebrations will be taking place, and has been hosting an annual Mardi Gras live feed since 1999. Wondering about how risqué things can get with people getting drunk and ladies on the hunt for Mardi Gras beads? Well, the footage will be authentic and there will be no editing, so you can see anything.

“Our intention is to portray New Orleans in a positive light,” said Nicole Veenstra from EarthCam to YahooTravel. “That being said, the footage is live-streaming and unedited, so anything can happen!”

According to NOLA.com, there will be four parades in Uptown New Orleans (Krewe of Zulu, Krewe of Rex, Krewe of Elks Orleans, and Krewe of Crescent City), one in West Bank (Krewe of Grela), one in Covington (Krewe of Lyra), and three in Metairie (Krewe of Argus, Krewe of Elks Jefferson, and Krewe of Jefferson).
